The Chairman welcomed the Senate members to the meeting and requested Secretary, Senate to present the agenda of the 54th Senate meeting.

Item No. 54.1 Confirmation of the Minutes of the 52nd Senate Meeting

The minutes of the $53^{\rm rd}$ Senate meeting were confirmed by the Senate without any amendments.



Item No. 54.2 Action Taken Report

The Senate of the Institute noted the Action Taken Report.

Item No. 54.3 To consider issues related to the UG and PG studies

The Senate approved/ratified the resolutions of UGAC/PGAC meetings held on 31.05.2019, 27.06.2019 and 18.07.2019.

The award of "Best Undergraduate project" to Biswaranjan Pati (15/ME/125) and "Best Postgraduate Project" to Somnath Chowdhury (17CH4101) was approved by the Senate.

Item No. 54.4 To consider issues related to the PhD studies

The award of PhD degree to 18 candidates and the registration of 7 candidates for the PhD program were approved by the Senate (Annexures I and II). The Senate also approved/ratified the minutes of the RAC meetings held on 31.05.2019 and 18.07.2019.

It was resolved that in view of the 15th Convocation, the defence of PhD thesis shall be held till 28/08/2019 and resume on 09/09/2019.

Item No. 54.5 To issues pertaining to the 15th Convocation

The Senate was informed that the hon'ble Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modi has been invited to be the Chief Guest for the 15th Convocation. In case, the Prime Minister Office intimates his inability, Chairman, Senate was empowered by the Senate to invite eminent personalities from Science/technology organizations as the Chief Guest and Guest of Honour.

Academic Section will make it mandatory for the degree awardees to submit data as to their future engagements in jobs/ higher studies/ GATE qualification, etc. in a standard format.

Item No. 54.6 To consider a system of assessing the performance of the academic departments on the delivery of academic programs

The Senate constituted the following committee to evolve a matrix and system of assessing the performance of academic departments and centres with respect to teaching-learning process, research output, effective utilization of funds granted, etc. The committee will submit its report to Chairman, Senate by August 23, 2019. The process will help identify the strengths and weakness of the departments, and also encourage the well-performing departments with endowment of additional grants, if required.

Item No. 54.7 To consider the list of awardees of the degrees and the gold medals in the 15th Convocation

The lists of awardees of degrees and gold medals were approved by the Senate.

Item No. 54.8 To consider the regulations of the Incubation Centre

The regulation was approved by the Senate with a revision in the eligibility criteria that companies formed under the Societies' Registration Act would also be eligible for being incubated. The Senate advised exploration of innovation and incubation related schemes including the PRISM Scheme run by the DSIR, Government of India for garnering funds towards incubation promotion. The Senate further stressed on the need for increasing and safeguarding Institute IPR.

Item No. 54.9 To consider inclusion of faculty members from the TEQIP-III mentee institutions in the UGAC and the Senate of NIT Durgapur as invitee members

The Senate approved the inclusion of one faculty member from each of the two TEQIP-III mentee institutions, i.e. NIT Nagaland and Dumka Engineering College as invitee members in the UGAC and the Senate of NIT Durgapur as long as the mentorship continues.

Item No. 54.10 To consider the policy and mechanism for the award of doctorate honoris causa to eminent persons in the next convocation

The report submitted by the committee entrusted with the task of evolving policy and mechanism for the award of doctorate honoris causa to eminent persons in the next convocation was approved by the Senate. It was resolved that the committee shall propose the constitution of a **Search and Selection Committee (SSC)** and a **Final Nomination Committee (FNC)** along with further details by August 23, 2019 to the Chairman, Senate who was empowered by the Senate to approve the same. The Senate resolved to initiate the award from the 16th Convocation.

Item No. 54.11 To consider the norms for offering online courses as suggested by the MHRD

The committee already constituted for the purpose will submit a comprehensive report to Chairman, Senate by August 23, 2019. Department of MS and other departments were advised to explore the possibility of offering online diploma/certificate courses which might have substantial demand with requisite contact hours, if needed.

It was further resolved that the DAC, EE will decide the norm of sharing revenues generated in the High Voltage laboratory.

Item No. 54.12 To formulate the guidelines for offering student internship at NIT Durgapur

The Senate approved offering internship to meritorious students from other institutions for a period spanning between



six weeks to six months. It was resolved that the departments shall notify the induction of interns on the website well in advance. The departments may charge internship fee towards consumables, if required. Accommodation to interns may be provided in the student hostels subject to availability, with a seat rent of Rs 1000/- per head per month. Financial support may be extended to the interns by the PIs from their projects, if available, on a case to case basis but no financial support shall be extended by the Institute. It was further resolved that the National Academies may be contacted by supervisors and individual faculty members for providing mentorship and guidance to Academy Summer Interns who are supported by the national academies. The supervisor shall issue a certificate to the student on successful completion of the internship.

Item No. 54.13 To admit foreign students directly to the UG, PG and PhD programmes

The following committee was constituted by the Senate to explore the modalities for participating in "Study in India" scheme of the MHRD to admit foreign students, in addition to the existing routes.

Item No. 54.14 To offer joint masters programmes with other universities/national institutes

The Senate resolved that the proposal may be revisited in future, if needed.

Item No. 54.16 To nominate "Student Invitees" for the Senate of the Institute

The norm for the nomination of "Student Invitees" was revised by the Senate as under:

The following two student invitees shall be nominated to the Senate.

- 1. The female student obtaining the highest CGPA in the second semester of the PG programs
- A student nominated by the Student Gymkhana

The student invitees shall be from two different departments. The tenure shall be for the on-going academic session.

The Senate requested the Dean (Academic) and the Dean (SW) to submit the list to Chairman, Senate who was empowered by the Senate to approve the same.

Item No. 54.17 To institute the Distinguished Alumnus Award

The Senate approved the norms submitted by the committee constituted for the purpose of instituting the Distinguished Alumnus Award. The committee will propose the constitution of the **Screening Committee** and the **Standing Committee** to the Chairman, Senate by August 23, 2019. The Standing committee shall be the same as the Final Nomination Committee (FNC) for the award of doctorate honoris causa. Chairman, Senate was empowered by the Senate to approve the same.

The Senate nominated Mr. Sumant Bhargavan, Executive Director, ITC Limited (Excellence in Corporate & Industry) and Kamanio Chattopadhyay, Honorary Professor. Department of Materials Engineering, IISC Bangalore (Excellence in Academics & Research) for the Distinguished Alumnus Award - 2019. The award shall be conferred during the 15th Convocation. A consent letter shall be sought from the awardees.

Item No. 54.18.

54.18.1 To decide the minimum and maximum number of students in an elective course

The Senate resolved that an UG Elective Course shall be offered provided there are at least the five of students opting for the course. The concerned faculty member offering a departmental elective course may decide on the maximum number of students that can be taken, while the Academic Section shall decide on the maximum number of students in each Open Elective course as is the existing practice. In case of a high demand by the students for a particular Open Elective course, it may be offered by the department in both Odd and Even semesters.

54.18.2 To approve the resolutions of the PGAC meeting held on 29/07/2019

The Senate approved/ratified the resolutions of the PGAC meeting held on 29/07/2019.

54.18.3 To provide a Provisional Certificate to the PhD student after PhD thesis defence

The Senate resolved that the Dean (Academic) shall issue a Provisional Certificate to a PhD student the day after the successful defence of PhD thesis, stating that the candidate has successfully defended



his/her PhD thesis, stating that the candidate has successfully defended his/her PhD thesis fulfilling all the conditions stipulated by the Senate of the Institute.

The Senate of the Institute in its 54th meeting held on July 30, 2019 constituted a two member committee to explore the modalities for participating in 'Study in India' scheme of the MHRD to admit foreign students, in addition to the existing routes. The committee met on 16.08.2019 and 20.08.2019 and initiated communications with Educational Consultants India Limited (EdCIL), an implementing agency under the MHRD. Deputy Registrar (Academic & Examinations) was present in both the meetings as an invitee. The following findings are reported.

Findings of the Committee on 'Study in India' (SII) Programme

- SII is a mega project by the Govt. of India under the aegis of the Ministry of Human Resources (MHRD) in collaboration with Ministry of External Affairs, which was launched on 18th of April, 2018.
- 2. The programme aims to make India as the preferred destination for education leveraging value and globally competitive standard of education and also to increase the number of incoming students to India by three times by FY 2023.
- 3. Indian universities/colleges are shortlisted on the basis their both NIRF Rankings and NAAC accreditation score and 101 top Indian educational institutions have given their consent and offered ~31000 seats with ~2600 courses ranging across UG, PG, PhD Programme through the SII portal(studyinindia.gov.in), targeting 30 countries.
- 4. EdCIL (India) Limited A PSU under MHRD is the implementing agency for the same. In the current admission cycle Study in India attracted 70000+ registrations so far.
- 5. SII scheme strictly partners with Higher Education Institutes which are eligible as per the following norms:
 - a) Both NIRF Top 100 in any category except medical and NAAC grading of >= 3.26
 - b) Or Institute of Eminence
 - c) Or Institute of National importance
- 6. SII scheme has an inherent feature of offering tuition fee waiver to meritorious foreign students, where all 'Partnering Institutes' are expected to offer tuition fee waivers to meritorious foreign students under SII programme.
- 7. Besides fee waivers, "Study in India Scholarship" scheme was introduced by SII which offers ~ USD 3500 per annum to top meritorious students.
- 8. Participation in SII programme is a voluntary exercise wherein the 'Partnering Institutes' are required to commit seats (out of their total seats) and fee waivers for overseas students in the portal being created by EdCIL on behalf of Ministry of HRD.
- 9. 'Partnering Institute' would be required to offer admission based on the selection of overseas candidates made through the counseling process on central admission portal and should not deny admission with or without committed fee waivers to the student.

10. SII will roll out a conditional admission letter stating the terms of admission. Final admission would be subject to document verification.

- 11. In addition to the above, in any rare circumstance, if another round of 'virtual interview' is required, the same would have to be intimated in advance to EdCIL for being categorically mentioned in the conditional admission letter.
- 12. 'Partnering Institute' should provide an International hostel and a dedicated fully functional International Student Affairs office for the foreign students and should have supporting facilities for on-boarding of students and their engagements throughout the stay.

 They would also be open to introducing any overseas student friendly facilities as may be mutually agreed with EdCIL.
- 13. The institute should provide the fee waivers as committed by them on the central portal www.studyinindia.gov.in
- 14. Institutes should arrange the 'mentorship programme' like assigning buddies to each of the student admitted through the central portal.
- 15. If in case the FRRO(Foreigner Regional Registration Offices) verification is delegated to the Institutes, 'Partnering Institutes' should be willing to act as a local FRRO office for the foreign students.
- 16. All the responsibilities of verification of certificates/mark sheets/documents etc. of the prospective student would lie with the Institution.
 Marks conversion/Equivalence criteria/Mutual recognition of courses would also be a responsibility of the 'Partnering Institute.'
- 17. Institute should provide updated information to EdCIL regarding students' final admission through the portal as and when the facility is provided on the portal.
- 18. Data transferred/collected by the Institute is the responsibility of the Institute
- 19. EdCIL shall ensure proper allocation/merit based allocation on the basis of the academic performance and choice filling of the student on the central portal.
- 20. EdCIL shall take care of the aggregated branding, social media and other media for the programme which may/may not include the details of the 'Partnering Institute.'
- 21. An agreement in the form of MoU has to be entered between the Institute and the EdCIL.
- 22. NIT Durgapur needs to nominate Nodal person(s) for official communications with EdCIL. The contact details of the Nodal person(s) are to be communicated to EdCIL (India) to get in touch with them.
- 23. It has been informed by EdCIL that NIT Durgapur is eligible to partner with SII as per the norms.
- 24. It has been informed that adding of partner institute will start in the last week of August 2019 and then an official communication will be sent to the institute.

National Institute of Technology Durgapur

Modalities for offering Masters Programmes with other Institutes/Universities

1. Definitions:

- (a) "NITD" means National Institute of Technology Durgapur.
- (b) "Foreign Educational Institution" means (i) an institution duly established or incorporated in its home country, offering educational programmes at the undergraduate, masters and higher levels in its home country and (ii) which proposes to offer a programme of study leading to the award of a master degree in a collaborative arrangement with NITD;
- (c) "Indian Educational Institution" means (i) an institution/university duly established in India, offering educational programmes at the undergraduate, masters and higher levels in India and (ii) which proposes to offer a programme of study leading to the award of a master degree in a collaborative arrangement with NITD;
- (d) "Collaboration", means an arrangement between NITD and a Foreign / Indian Educational Institution, put into place through an MoU leading to the award of a master degree;
- (e) "Degree" means a degree awarded by NITD;
- (f) A "Joint Master Degree" means a single master degree jointly awarded by NITD and the collaborating Foreign/Indian Educational Institution;

2. Objectives:

The primary objectives for offering Masters Programmes with other institutes/ Universities are furnished below.

- (a) Facilitate collaboration programme between NITD and Foreign/ Indian Universities/ Institutions to improve the quality of education in the field of science and technology and research.
- (b) Increase internationalisation of the institutions
- (c) Develop study and research alternatives in accordance with emerging needs
- (d) Offer students an expanded and innovative arena for learning
- (e) Increase candidates' employability and motivation for mobility in a global market
- (f) Increase competence at the partner institutions through cooperation and implementation of a best practice system
- (g) Contribute to tearing down cultural barriers, both personal and institutional

3. Eligibility criteria and conditions for collaborations:

(a) In case the partner institution is a foreign educational Institution, it must be accredited by authorized accreditation agency in its parent country.

- (b) In case the partner institution is an Indian educational Institution, it must be ranked within top 100 universities overall as per NIRF ranking or must have a THE/QS ranking.
- (c) Any course or programme which jeopardizes the national interest shall not be allowed to be offered.
- (d) Legalities and matters relating to the grievances of Indian students shall be addressed by NITD.

4. Types of Joint Master Programme

4.1 Collaborative Masters Programme: It refers to a situation when two or more institutions cooperate on a joint study programme that leads to a degree at one of the partner institutions. Each institution is responsible for admission and the award of degrees to its own students. The programme is developed and managed jointly, but each institution "owns" its own students.

The curriculum, syllabus, mode of delivery and other related issues may be developed and approved jointly. Credits earned at one institution shall be accepted by the other collaborating institution. However, the grade cards, transcripts and the degree shall be awarded by one institution. The degree certificate may indicate that the degree was offered in collaboration with another institution.

4.2 Joint Master Degree Programme: It refers to collaboration between two or more institutions on a joint study programme leading to the award of a joint master degree. The degree certificate should include the name of all participating institutions and their seals. All partner institutions are responsible for the entire programme and not just their own students. The students admitted should spend at least one semester in a foreign/Indian partner Institution for course work. Thesis should be supervised jointly.

The curriculum, syllabus, mode of delivery and other related issues shall be developed and approved jointly.

5. Criteria for assessing the suitability of the programme

The following criteria should be considered when assessing if NITD should enter into the joint master programme.

- (a) Joint master programmes should be relevant to the society.
- (b) Joint masters programmes should be in consonance with the strategic and academic priorities of NITD
- (c) Joint master programmes should be within an academic field where NITD has relevant competence.
- (d) Joint master programmes should stimulate increased student mobility
- (e) Joint master programmes should strengthen research-based teaching and collaboration.
- (f) Joint master programmes should be supported by the academic community and by the institution.
- (g) Academic, administrative and economic resources must be available. A list of faculty members willing to participate in the programme should be submitted along with the NOC from concerned academic departments/centres of excellence.

6. Programme Elements

The following programme elements should be decided based on mutual discussion/communication.

- (a) Name of the degree
- (b) Type of Programme (Collaborative Master Programme / Joint Master Degree Programme)
- (c) Language of instruction
- (d) Place of study for different courses; residential requirement at the partner institution for coursework
- (e) The relevance of the programme
- (f) Expected learning outcome on completion of the programme (knowledge, skills and general competence)
- (g) Eligibility criteria and Admission procedure
- (h) Sanctioned intake of students
- (i) The academic curriculum and credit requirements
- (i) Syllabus, pedagogy and modes of delivery (including online courses)
- (k) Possible joint thesis supervision and expected outcome in terms of joint publications, IPR etc.
- (I) Assessment methods and the grading scales used at the respective partner institutions. If the grading scales are different, equivalence has to be specified.
- (m)Fee structure of the NITD students and their possible fee waiver for the courses at the partner institution and vice versa
- (n) Financial assistance to the students
- (o) Accommodation facility for NITD students at the partner institution and the students of the partner institution at NITD
- (p) Transfer of credits, if applicable

7. Agreement Process

MoU should be signed among the partner institutions for each programme as detailed below.

- (a) The eligibility of the partner institution(s) should be assessed.
- (b) The suitability of the masters programme should be assessed by NITD and the possible partner institution(s) (cl. 5)
- (c) The type of the masters programme (Collaborative Masters Programme / Joint Degree Programme) should be selected (cl. 4).
- (d) The programme elements (cl. 6) should be finalized.
- (e) An MoU incorporating the programme details shall be placed to the Senate for recommendation.
- (f) The MoU shall be placed to the BoG of NITD for endorsement (foreign institutions) / for approval (Indian institutions).
- (g) In case the partner institution is foreign, the MoU shall be submitted to the MHRD, Government of India for approval.
- (h) Appropriate approval shall be obtained by the partner institution(s) too as per their requirement.
- (i) The MoU shall be signed by the Director/Vice Chancellor/President or the competent authority of the partner institutions.

- (j) The agreement must indicate that Collaborative/Joint Master Degree Programme shall start after all details are approved by both Institutions.
- (k) The MoU shall indicate its date of enforcement, duration of the agreement and procedures related to amendments, renewal or termination.

8. Conduct of the Joint Masters Programme

- (a) Any department(s) /centre(s) of excellence at NITD shall be eligible to offer the programme on behalf of NITD.
- (b) A Programme Coordinator in each participating institute shall coordinate the programme on behalf of that institution. All correspondence related to the programme must be made by participating institutions through the Programme Coordinator.
- (c) A Programme Academic Committee (PAC) shall be constituted at NITD to take care of the administrative and academic activities for the programme. If the programme is offered by a single academic department / centre of excellence, its DPAC will act as the PAC. If it is a joint endeavour of more than one department/centre, the PAC shall act as the DPAC for the programme.
- (d) Further academic decision-making shall be routed through DPAC, PGAC and the Senate.

9. Other type of Joint Masters Programmes

NITD may also participate in the reputed International Joint Masters Programmes like Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degrees as per their terms and conditions. NITD may also participate in such similar programmes if organized by the Government of India in future.

Subject: Amendment of Library book issue/return rule

Respected Sir,

Central Library follows book Issue/Return rule approved by the Senate in its 48th Meeting (Agenda Item No.48.11), initially Central Library was colleting fine Rs. 5.00 per day per book after the period of six months from the students.

Some students raised concern over it and collection of fine stopped since December 2018 and the same was put before the Library Committee on 27.02.2019 (Agenda item number #3) and committee suggested to review the late fine as below:

- a. ₹5.00 per week per book.
- b. Beyond one month ₹10.00 per week per book.
- c. Discontinuation of library membership may be happened if books are not return within the stipulated time.
- d. The fine will be applied after doing the necessary up gradation of the system (no manual calculation would be allowed)
- e. Committee also suggested to increase one more book to issue to the students (UG & PG).

The matter may be discussed in the forthcoming Senate Meeting for the necessary amendment.

Item No. 48.9: To set up the Sponsored Research & Consultancy Cell (SRCC) in the Institute

The Senate ratified the resolution of the meeting of the Heads and Deans (Item # 01.09) held on December 04, 2017 on this matter. It will be headed by Dean (R&C), one Assistant Registrar and one staff member will be inducted to the SRCC for day-to-day activities of SRCC and maintaining accounts, etc. The Institute purchase policy adhering to GFR 2017 shall be followed by the SRCC. A detailed report on the same shall be submitted shortly.

Item No. 48.10: To set up a Continuing Education Cell (CEC) in the Institute

The Senate of the Institute approved setting up of a Continuing Education Cell (CEC) in the Institute as resolved in the meeting of the Heads and Deans (Item # 01.13) held on December 04, 2017. The cell will be responsible for conducting all short term courses. All short term courses which are currently running shall be brought under the umbrella of CEC. Future courses under CEC should be adopted through Senate. CEC will report all academic matters under its purview to the Senate. CEC shall be headed by a Professor-incharge (Continuing Education Program).

Item No. 48.11: To consider the rules for Central Library of the Institute regarding issue and return of books (pending item # 47.11)

The Senate of the Institute approved the proposed norms of issue and return of books in the Central Library.

Suggestions from the faculty members and the students will be taken in order to improve the functioning of the Central Library of the Institute.

Item No. 48.12: To consider revision in the PhD regulations with respect to the nomination of the examiners of the PhD thesis

The Senate of the Institute resolved that the resolution on item# 47.5 in the 47th Senate meeting on the above matter shall be revoked.

A panel of examiners from amongst the faculty members or eminent experts, preferably Professors / Retired Professors / Emeritus Professors, and researchers with Ph.D. in institutes / universities / research laboratories / industries of repute is to be submitted to Chairman, Senate through Dean (Academic). The area of his/her specialization is to be mentioned explicitly along with a hyperlink to his/her web page. In the list of examiners from abroad, there shall be at least three experts not of Indian origin. There should not be any conflict of interest in the selection of the panel of examiners.

The decision of the Chairman, Senate shall be final in the nomination of the examiners.

Item No. 48.13: To apprise the Senate of the complaint of Shri Manish Kumar Mehrotra

The Senate of the Institute was apprised of the matter and it was noted that the reasons for the decision of the Senate on this matter was inadvertently not recorded explicitly in the minutes of the meeting.

Rule for borrowing books from the Central Library

All the students and employees of the Institute can register themselves for the membership of the Central Library. Each member is provided with a Central Library membership card. The categories of members and their privileges are as follows:

1. Faculty & Staff:

3. Conditions on Loan

i. The Librarian reserves the right to recall any book issued to the members even prior to the due date of return.

- ii. Reference books, thesis and other special reading materials shall not ordinarily be loaned to the members except faculties for maximum of 15 days
- iii. Multiple copies of same book are not allowed to issue to one user.
- iv. User can get issued Reference Books / Journals / Magazines /Reference documents (Between 2:00 PM to 5:30 PM) and have to return within the opening hours of the Central Library on next working day after depositing their library card.
- v. Bound Volumes of periodicals will be lent to faculties for 30 days only.
- vi. Unbound periodicals may only be borrowed by the faculties only for a period of one (1) week. However, the latest issue shall not be lent out.
- vii. Members should return Library books before the due date, failing which an overdue charge of ₹ 5.00 per day per book shall be imposed.

4. Fine:

- i. After due date ₹ 5.00 per day per book shall be imposed as late fine.
- ii. Faculties, Administrative Staffs and non-teaching staffs of the Institute are exempted from the fine. But they have to return the issued book after the completion of the due date/semester, whichever is earlier.

5. Loss/damage of Books:

- i. Members shall have to replace the book(s) with new latest edition or will have to pay the present market price of the book(s).
- ii. If a book so lost belongs to a set/multi volume and is not available separately the members shall have to replace the whole set/all volumes or pay the Current Market Price of the set.
- iii. If book is out of print then 5 times of the purchase cost will be recovered.
- iv. If book is old more than 5 years then the cost will be charged double of the cost price on the intervals of 5 years.
- v. In case of lost book is available in low cost, in this situation cost price of the book will be charged or whichever is more.
- vi. A soft cover or low priced edition will not be accepted in lieu of a hard cover edition.
- vii. If issued book is defaced or damaged ₹ 50.00/- will be charged, if not reusable then fine may be decided by the Librarian.
- viii. Librarian reserve the right to change/modify the existing rule which is not mentioned if required with consultation of Director/Registrar as per the situation arises.
- ix. In case of loss of rare/valuable books Director may impose more fines/disciplinary action in conjunction with above rules with the recommendation of the Librarian.

6. Working Hours:

The Central Library shall remain open all days of the year except gazette holidays or notified by the Institute authorities.

The working hours of the Central Library are:

Monday to Friday

8.30 A.M. to 9.30 P.M.

Saturday & Sundays:

9.00 A. M. to 5.00 P.M.

Circulation: 8:30 AM to 6:30 PM (Weekdays)



7. General Instructions:

- i. Central Library is a place of individual study and research; members should maintain an atmosphere of dignity, peace and silence within the Central Library premises.
- ii. No discussion permitted inside the Central Library.
- iii. Display your identity/library card when requested.
- iv. Outwears, handbags, files, umbrellas and similar items should be deposited at the check point/ property counter before entering to the Central Library.
- v. Use of mobile phones inside the Central Library is strictly prohibited. No refreshments or foodstuff of any kind shall be consumed anywhere inside the Central Library.
- vi. Members should return all materials borrowed from the Central Library before proceeding on any kind of long leave.
- vii. Members should not sub lend the materials borrowed from the Central Library.
- viii. Materials that are issued should be produced for the security to check.
- ix. Suggestions for purchasing books and other materials and improving the Central Library services are welcome.
- x. If library card is lost immediately inform the Central Library to prevent misuse of the card. A new duplicate library card may be get issued from the Central Library after the payment of ₹ 500/- (Rupees five hundred only)
- xi. If library property counter token is lost ₹ 150/- (Rupees One hundred fifty only) will be charged. If so, immediately inform the security after justifying can take your belongings.
- xii. A misplaced book is temporarily lost. To avoid misplacement, books which are taken from the open shelves should be left on the nearest table/trolley. Library materials should be handled with utmost care. Nobody should write damage and make any mark on any kind of library materials. Materials damaged, defected or lost must be replaced; otherwise the present cost will be realized from the borrower as per rule.
- xiii. The Librarian has the right to cancel the library cards and refuse admission to anyone who violates the rules and regulations of the library or indulges in any other type of misconduct.

8. Clearance Certificate

Borrower's membership card is the property of the Central Library and must be returned to the Central Library at the end of the period.

All those who leave the Institute must return the books issued to them and surrender their membership cards to the Central Library, to avoid any overdue charges obtain a "Clearance Certificate" from the librarian.

- d. The fine will be applied after doing the necessary up gradation of the system (no manual calculation would be allowed).
- e. Committee suggests increasing one more book to the students (UG & PG).

Agenda Item No.4# Any other matter.

- a. Library timing. In view of the Office Order NITD/Estt./3701/2019 dated Feb. 21, 2019 and several request for the student side, the committee suggests to increase the library timing up to 12:00 mid-night. Central Library will take necessary action to implement the same.
- b. Disposal of old, obsolete, damaged print journals and news papers. Committee suggests for necessary steps to dispose the old newspapers, damage magazines. However, committee suggests rethinking, and find alternatives to archive the old journals (print). It is also suggested to form a Committee to evaluate the status of the old journals (print). The matter would be discussed in the next meeting.
- c. Book requisition. To make the availability of required books Central library will accept request from the students also for the books. Request slip need to be verified and forwarded by the concerned head of the department.
- d. Budget for Print Books. Committee also suggested to put the budget proposal to purchase the books (Text, general and reference books), for the coming financial year. Required amount is approx Rupees 1 crore (₹1,00,00,000).
