The applications that were received within the closing date (25.07.2019) were scrutinize meticulously by the Screening Committee as per the guidelines of the New Recruitment Rules 2019 and the list of the shortlisted candidate was uploaded on the Institute website.

The shortlisted candidates were informed by email for interview in due time. The selection committee was duly constituted as per the norms of statutes of NITs. The interview was held on 26.07.2019 in the presence of the SC representative, the ST representative and the Observer.

The recommendations of the Selection Committee for departmental promotions in different cadres, viz. Joint Registrar (GP Rs. 8700/-), Assistant Registrar (GP Rs. 6600/-) and Technical Officer (GP Rs. 6600/-) is being placed in sealed covers before the Board of Governors for kind perusal and necessary approval.

A total of 21 applications were received for consideration for the Higher Administrative Grade (HAG) against the Institute notification, out of which 14 were shortlisted. 55.10 To report the progress on TEQIP-III to the Board

NIT Durgapur has been selected as one of the Mentor Institute under TEQIP III and got responsibility for mentoring the Dumka Engineering College, Dumka, Jharkhand and the NIT Nagaland as Mentee Institutes. NIT Durgapur received a sanction of Rs. 7 Crore under TEQIP III, and an additional Rs. 3 Crore was received towards the development of the Centre of Excellence (COE) on Advanced Materials. Out of the total allocation of Rs. 10 Crore, an amount of Rs. 4.4 Crore is being utilized for procurement (Rs. 3.5 crores under TEQIP III and Rs. 0.9 crores under COE) and the rest is being utilized for academic activities like students' learning, faculty & staff development, R&D, Reforms, I-I-I, Mentoring, etc. and operating cost.

Items for procurement worth Rs. 4.25 Crore has been ordered out of which items of worth Rs. 2.3 Crore has already been received. An XRD costing around Rs. 1.09 Crore is expected to be received within October 2019. The actual expenditure under academic head and IOC till 21.10.19 is about Rs. 2.66 Crore.


Twinning activities with Dumka Engineering College has been stepped up but the pace is not slower when it comes to with NIT Nagaland. Second Performance audit and mentoring were completed successfully on during August 13-15, 2019 and August 27-28, 2019 respectively. It is to be noted that the second performance audit of the Institute has achieved the performance benchmark of Mentor Institute as set by the NPIU.

Two Writ Petitions filed by Dr. Sujit Karmakar and Dr. Ranjan Kumar Mitra has been received by the MHRD from the Department of Legal Affairs, Branch Secretariat, Kolkata vide communication no. 1423-1426/HRD/Lit-III/4489 dated August 27, 2019 and the respondents, i.e. NIT Durgapur has been directed to file their affidavit in opposition.

As suggested earlier by the Ministry, NIT Durgapur is working in close association with the ASG and his team appointed in regard to the cases filed in the Kolkata High Court. As the then ASG has been elevated to the position of Hon'ble Judge in the Kolkata High Court, NIT Durgapur is waiting till the time the new ASG assumes position. In the meantime, however, the lawyers appointed earlier to contest in individual cases in keeping with the suggestion of the ASG are being retained.



The Board of Governors desired that the recommendation of the selection committee meeting be placed in its next meeting.







Counsel for NIT Durgapur also undertook that NIT Durgapur shall pay the salary after absorption of these two applicants from their own funds...". The Hon'ble CAT Calcutta Bench passed the verdict that "In view of the aforesaid undertaking, the Ld. Counsel for the applicants is permitted to withdraw the O.A. with the aforesaid observation."

The financial implications appear to be huge if NIT Durgapur has to comply with the verdict. I write this letter to you to provide further clarifications in contrast to our submission in Point No. 4 of the subject communication, a scanned copy of which you must have received.

1. As directed by the Ministry of Human Resource Development communication no. 33-2/2013-TS-II dated December 9, 2013, a Committee was constituted vide NIT Durgapur Office Order No. NITD/Estab/3718 dated December 31, 2013 (**Annexure I**) to assess the possibility of re-deployment of staff members of the erstwhile NTMIS of the then Regional Engineering College, Durgapur.
2. In its deliberations, the Committee so constituted found that in terms of his qualifications Mr. Anupam Bagchi was eligible for the post of Scientific/Technical Officer/Assistant Registrar and below. (**Annexure II**)
3. The aforementioned Committee also found that Mr. Aranya Basu Roy was eligible for positions in the lower Technical/Administrative cadre. (**Annexure II**)
4. The report of the aforementioned Committee was placed before the Board of Governors in its 30th Meeting held on January 24, 2014 at Kolkata. The Board of Governors approved the report against agenda item No. 30.11. (**Annexure III**)
5. A case was filed in the Hon'ble CAT, Calcutta Bench by Mr. Aranya Basu Roy and Mr. Anupam Bagchi on September 1, 2014.
6. In respect of the cases filed by Mr. Aranya Basu Roy (No. MA 350/00334/2014, MA 350/00052/2016 and OA/350/01133/2014) and those filed by Mr. Anupam Bagchi (No. MA 350/00336/2014, 350/00111/2016 and OA 350/01139/2014), the Hon'ble CAT in its verdict dated December 20, 2016 observed "that the Ld. Counsel for NIT Durgapur also undertook that NIT Durgapur shall pay the salary after absorption of these two applicants from their own funds....". 43.12: The Board was informed, that the inquiry has been still pending, as suitable external members for inquiry committee could not be found. The Board suggested, that instead of the committee the task of inquiry may be handed over to any senior retired officer of Government, who is conversant with the Government of India rules and regulations.

43.16: The Board was informed, that the process of the faculty selection which was carried out in August 2016 stands annulled due to technical reasons.

Item#44.03: To consider the Minutes of the 38th Finance Committee meeting held on 25th May, 2016 and 39th Finance Committee meeting held on 28th September, 2016.

The Board perused the minutes of the 38th & 39th Finance Committee meetings threadbare. Following issues were discussed:-

Item # 38.03: While discussing item # 29.05 of the 29th B&WC regarding procurement of furniture for the International Hostel, the Board observed that the procurement of furniture for the international Hostel was not approved by the BoG earlier and the furniture had been procured on the basis of FC recommendation alone. Therefore, it is ex-post-facto approval. The Board directed that complete details of the case should be put up justifying and explaining the procurement process.

38.04: Regarding the procurement of bench top FT NMR 90MHz the Board was informed that item has still not been procured and would be procured when funds are available for same. The BoG asked NIT to bring it to the notice before procurement.

38.05: Regarding guidelines on expenditure out of CPDA, the Board was informed, that a committee had been formed by the standing committee of Council of NITSER to look into the matter and guidelines will be issued in due course, after these are approved by the competent authority. In the meanwhile however, audit objections should be taken into account, while utilising the CPDA.

38.06: The Board directed that the Institute should recoup the loan taken from the IRG as soon as capital grants are received from MHRD.

38.07: The Board informed that MHRD guide lines should be scrupulously followed in appropriation of the TEQIP funds.

38.08: It was reiterated, that MHRD guidelines should be followed while making expenditure out of TEQIP for enhancement of R&D and Industrial consultancy activities for interaction with industries and for faculty and staff development activities.

38.09: Regarding submission of Annual Accounts and Annual Report for Financial year 2014-15, the Board directed, that compliance report for the Financial Year 2014-15 & 2015 -16 should be placed for the perusal of the Board in the next BOG meeting.

38.10: B:- The Board suggested that the policy guidelines for Institutes funding of a specialised teaching cum research laboratories should be prepared and placed in the next BOG meeting.

38.10: C:- Regarding problems faced by the Institute with the NBCC, about delays in completion of various projects and lack of response by their officials, the Board informed that the CGM New Delhi be approached and if required, a meeting with him be arranged in MHRD, to resolve the outstanding issues.

The following issues were discussed while considering the minutes of the 39th FC meeting:

39.02: Regarding the issue of the contract for Scavenging and Cleaning discussed in Item 38.10 of 38th FC meeting, the Board suggested, that the Institute should award contract to more than one contractors to create redundancy. The provisions of GFR and CVC guidelines should be followed.

39.05: Regarding presentation of Dean (P&D) the Board recommended that detailed Agenda of the approved points should be placed to the BOG.

39.07: A:- The Board suggested, that NIT assets, which were deployed elsewhere for the Geothermal Project should be retrieved, without waiting for directions/ reply from the MHRD on the report submitted to them on earlier. Action taken in this regard be reported to the BOG in its next meeting.

Item#44.04: To peruse the Minutes of 43rd Senate Meeting held on 25th September, 2016.

As per Statutory provisions, minutes of Senate meeting are not to be placed in the BOG. Only items which have been mentioned in Statues and also involving financial implication may be placed to the BoG.

Item#44.05: To peruse the Minutes of the 44th Senate Meeting held on 09th January, 2016.

As per Statutory provisions, minutes of Senate meeting are not to be placed in the BOG. Only items which have been mentioned in Statues and involving financial implications may be placed to the BoG.

Item#44.06: Chairman's proposal for 2017:

The Chairman raised the issue of pending actions on various points, some of which had been resolved in the previous meeting and have been pending or incomplete action. He informed that he had handed over the list of some 30 odd points to the Registrar during his previous visit to NITD. He stated, that either the action should be completed or if due to any reason, action was not possible same should be apprised to the Board.

He further raised the issue of patents and IPR. He felt that the point was very important for NBA Accreditation however adequate attention was not being paid to it and same needs to be addressed on priority.

The Chairman was informed that some of his proposals had already been addressed and taken up in the 44th Senate meeting on 09th January, 2017.

Chairman's proposal regarding having an Open House, invited comments from members. The Board felt that Open House could be in the form of presentations being made by Research Scholars, to be attended by UG & PG students for better learning and interaction. While it was Ok to have interaction with Industry and other Educational Institute Students, opening it to common public was not recommended.

Item#44.07: Director's report on the initiatives undertaken since the last Board of Governors Meeting.

Director informed the Board about various achievements during the intervening period from the previous BOG meeting. He brought out the following:-

- a) NBA accreditation of eight programmes.
- b) Six more programmes lined up for accreditation from February 10 to 12.
- c) Regarding recruitment to non faculty posts he stated that the advertisement had been issued and large number of applications had been received. The scrutiny of the same is in progress and interviews would be carried out shortly.

In view of Chairman's stand on the subject of powers of non full time Director, the board decided that in the absence of permanent director the advertisement for recruitment to permanent faculty and non faculty positions should be cancelled. However, it was felt by the Board that wherever, the Board is competent authority for appointments and decision making, such restrictions on decision making due to non permanent Director should not be there. However, Board may take up with MHRD for any special approval if necessary.

Item#44.08: To consider the concerns of existing Associate Professors of AGP 9000/- at NIT Durgapur.

Regarding the concerns of the Associate Professors with AGP Rs. 9000/- it was resolved that the details of the case be forwarded to MHRD for resolution.

Item#44.09: Proposal for treating Hostel/Mess Employees as permanent employees of NIT Durgapur.

Desired documents and information were not available to facilitate discussion and hence the BoG directed NIT to bring all relevant information in the next meeting.

Item#44.10: Revision of pension of pre-2006 pensioners (staff & faculty) in NIT Durgapur (Centrally Funded Technical Institution) in compliance of the judicial pronouncements of Hon'ble Supreme court of India.

Board resolved that matter may be referred to MHRD for guidance.

Item#44.11: Hiring of Staff for the Centre of Excellence.

The Board was intimated that equipment purchased will be unutilized if there is no one to operate. Therefore, existing staff that is operating these equipments should be hired, however, the TEQIP funding is no longer available for hiring. The Board recommended that as per standard practice, after the termination of the project the user departments be responsible for maintenance and management of facilities. The technical man power required for maintenance should be available from the allocation of regular staff to respective departments. The Board approves appointment of temporary staff from the revenue generated from services provided by the facilities. A long term plan should be worked out for maintenance of specialized facilities of the departments.

Item#44.12: Audit Observations regarding Selection and Service conditions of Brig A. S. Nijjar, Registrar NIT Durgapur.

AS Nijjar, Registrar, recused himself from the meeting.

The matter was discussed in details, however, there were requirement of additional documents and information to arrive at the decision. It was resolved that matter may be referred to Ministry of HRD for their guidance.

Item#44.13: Information to the Board.

Noted.

Item#44.14: Presentation by Dean R&C on management of Project Cell.

Presentation of Dean R&C was cancelled.

Item 44.15: Mentoring of GKCIET, Malda.

Referring to some communication addressed to Chairman BoG, NIT Durgapur, received from MHRD, regarding administrative matters related to GKCIET Malda, the Chairman expressed his views that in the presence of separate Board of GKCIET Malda, BoG NIT Durgapur should not be involved in administrative matter of that Institute.

Item#44.16: Appeal of Shri Jiban Krishna Ray, Sr. Assistant, Personnel Section for re-consideration seniority.



Item#44.17: Any other item with the permission of the chair.

Regarding absorption of the erstwhile employee of NTMIS, the Board was informed about the decision based on various resolutions and court orders.

The Board recommended that Institute should appeal against the Court verdict.

This is in connection with the Order No. F.5-7/2017 TS.III dated August 22, 2019 in regard of the order of the Hon'ble High Court, Kolkata dated June 25, 2019.

In response, the following may kindly be noted.

1. As directed by the Hon'ble High Court, Kolkata, National Institute of technology Durgapur will honour recommendations of the Bhat Committee and the subsequent MHRD Office Order No. 33/2/2013/TS/2 dated December 9, 2013.

Accordingly, Mr. Aranya Basu Roy and Mr. Anupam Bagchi may be considered absorption.

2. Mr. Aranya Basu Roy (date of birth 06.05.1959) has already reached superannuation age, and therefore he cannot be absorbed by National Institute of Technology Durgapur.
3. National Institute of Technology Durgapur will apply one time age relaxation in keeping with the provisions of the new recruitment Rules 2019 for the case of Mr. Anupam Bagchi in compliance with the Bhat Committee recommendations and consider absorbing him in a cadre suitable to his qualification and experience through the open recruitment process to be held as per the Institute schedule.
4. Since during the interim period from the closure of the NTMIS (31.03.2013 to date) National Institute of Technology Durgapur has not taken any service from Aranya Basu Roy and Anupam Bagchi, the question of arrears and retrospective effect is not tenable.
5. The above shall be placed before the Board of Governors in its 54th Meeting scheduled on August 29, 2019.
6. The above actions are taken on the directives of the Hon'ble court and this shall not be taken as a precedence.

Subject: Regarding absorption of erstwhile NTMIS staff in service

Sir,

This is to write with reference to the orders dated 25.06.2019 passed by Hon'ble High Court at Calcutta in writ petition no. 10513 (W) of 2019 titled Aranaya Basu Roy Vs. the Union of India & ors. regarding absorption of the erstwhile NTMIS staff in your Institute. In this connection, Sh. Bharat Bhushan, Advocate of the petitioners has sent a copy of the above mentioned orders of the Hon'ble High Court vide his letter dated 08.07.2019 which is also addressed to the Director, NIT, Durgapur, requesting for compliance of the Court orders within the stipulated time frame. The operative part of the order is reproduced as under:

"That there are vacancies in the post in question in NIT, Durgapur. The respondents can consider absorbing the petitioner at NIT Durgapur but in case, the respondents come to a conclusion that there is no vacancy in NIT Durgapur presently, the respondents will take steps to absorb the petitioner in some other institutions, like AICTE or any other institutions, which under the control of MHRD.

The respondents shall relax the criteria of age considering the fact that the petitioner has served the institutions for a considerable long period of time since 1989"

The above matter had been taken up with your office earlier also vide this Council's letter of even no. dated 21.06.2018 followed by reminders dated 12.10.2018 and dated 03.06.2019 with regard to the absorption of (i) Sh. Prasanta Mukherjee, Clerk-cum-typist (ii) Sh.A.B. Roy, CO-cum-CP and (iii) Sh. Anupam Bagchi, Research Associate, the erstwhile staff of NTMIS Nodal Centre by NIT Durgapur. However, the above staff has not been absorbed in your Institution and you have asked from the MHRD a clear and unambiguous directive in the matter as informed vide your office letter dated 10.06.2019. It needs to be remembered that Ministry of HRD in their recent directive vide their letter no. 33/02/2015-TS.II (Pt.) dated 02.07.2019 has again reminded for absorption of NTMIS staff as per the decision taken by the then Secretary (H.E.) in a meeting held on 22.01.2013 (copy enclosed). This has also been followed up with your office by this Council vide letter of even no. dated 02.08.2019, but, action has not been taken by your office so far.

In this connection, it may be recalled that as per order dated 09.11.1983 issued by MHRD, a Nodal Centre for implementation of NTMIS Scheme was functioning at your Institute.

The NTMIS scheme was closed on 31.03.2013. AICTE has already released payment of salary arrears as admissible to the staff members of Nodal Centre, Durgapur for the period up to 31.03.2013.


The MHRD had constituted a committee namely Bhat Committee vide order dated 11.05.2012 to examine the issues of erstwhile NTMIS scheme and to explore the possibility of adjusting such staff in their respective Institutions. The committee in their report dated 04.08.2012 had recommended for absorption of the eligible staff in service at appropriate level in the respective Institutions/ organizations where the Nodal Centers were operating against vacant posts. Subsequently, the MHRD had also written letters to the Nodal Centers stressing that the staff engaged in the erstwhile NTMIS Nodal Centers should be considered for absorption in the host institutions against suitable posts based on their educational qualifications and experience as recommended by the Bhat Committee.

Further, during the meeting held on 22.01.2013 under the chairmanship of Sh. Ashok Thakur, then Secretary, MHRD, it was also decided that in case no suitable is vacant/available in an institution supernumerary post (coterminous with superannuation of employees) may be created with the approval from the Ministry. Copy of the minutes of the above meeting is enclosed. Later, Ministry of HRD has reiterated its earlier decision of 2013 vide order dated 20.05.2016 (copy enclosed) that the staff engaged in erstwhile NTMIS Nodal Centers should be considered for absorption in the host Institutions against suitable posts based on their Educational Qualification and Experience as recommended by the Bhat Committee. Accordingly, the MHRD had requested all Nodal Centers to assess responsibility of re-deploying the erstwhile NTMIS staffs against existing vacancies of respective Nodal Centers.

In view of the position explained above, it may be seen that there is clear directive from the Ministry of HRD without any ambiguity in this regard and now follow up action in compliance with the orders of the Hon'ble Court for absorption of the staff has to be taken by NIT Durgapur. It needs to be appreciated that failure to comply with the orders of the Hon'ble High Court at Calcutta in this case may invite contempt of Court accompanied by adverse consequences. It is therefore necessary that the matter is given personal attention to ensure compliance of the Court orders immediately failing which the responsibility and answerability for contempt of Court will rest with NIT Durgapur.

In view of above, it needs to be clearly understood that an immediate action being need of the hour is required to be taken by you without further delay so as to avoid contempt proceedings against the Respondents by the Hon'ble Court. Compliance report in the matter may kindly be sent to this Council under intimation to the Ministry of HRD.

A meeting was held at 4.00 PM on 22nd January, 2013 under the Chairmanship of Shri Ashok Thakur, Secretary, MHRD in his room at Shastri Bhavan, New Delhi for finalization of MoU for National Information System for Technical Human Research (NISTCHR) and absorption of NTMIS staff. Based on the discussions in the meeting, the following decisions were taken.

- I. The present NTMIS Scheme would exist till 31st March, 2013.
- II.
 - a. A new Scheme named as National Information System for Technical Human Research (NISTCHR) would come into effect from 1st April, 2013 through an MoU to be signed between AICTE and IAMR on project basis.
 - b. A new MoU would be signed between AICTE and IAMR preferably during second week of February, 2013. Chairman, AICTE will submit a revised MoU in the first week of February, 2013 incorporating the following:
 - (i) The period of MoU should be initially for this Plan Period.
 - (ii) A Committee would be setup under the Chairmanship of Additional Secretary (T) for coordination which can meet once in six month or whenever necessary.
- III.
 - a. The staff engaged in the earlier Nodal Centres in the project NTMIS should be considered for absorption in the host institution against suitable posts based on their Educational Qualification and Experience, as recommended by the Bhat Committee. The existing employees may be given an age relaxation for the vacant posts existing in the host institutions for which they shall be considered.

- b. In case the host Institution is a state funded institution (not Centrally Funded Institution), the nearby MHRD Institution may be requested to consider for absorption of the staff.
- c. If no suitable post is vacant/available in such an Institution, Supernumerary post may be created.
- d. If any staff could not be absorbed by the Host/MHRD Institution, they will be engaged in the new scheme by IAMR. This provision would be specifically mentioned in MoU of NISTCHR.
- e. ~~Necessary approval from IFD of the Ministry shall be taken for~~ deployment of such staff in case supernumerary posts need to be created.

ORDER

This order is issued in compliance of order dated 20.11.2015 passed by the Hon'ble Central Administrative Tribunal, Guwahati Bench w.r.t. OA No. 373 of 2013 titled Dr. Bhupendra Goswami and other V/s Union of India and Another.

National Technical Manpower Information System (NTMIS) was set up in 1983 within the Ministry to generate and maintain a reliable database for planning and expansion of technical education in the country. This scheme was transferred to All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) in 1993 and was being implemented through institute of Applied Manpower Research (IAMR), New Delhi. The IAMR was set up by the Planning Commission in 1962 to evolve methods and techniques for manpower assessment, to advance knowledge on all aspects of human resource development and to provide advisory services for manpower research.

In this regard, NTMIS lead centre (IAMR) and 20 other Nodal Centers were established throughout the country. The Nodal Centres were expected to collect the data by employing students of senior classes, post graduate and Ph.D students on a nominal remuneration, who were called *Field Investigators*. Every Nodal Center was allowed to appoint 04 staff members, namely *Project Officer, Private Assistant, Research Associate and Computer Operator cum Programmer for disposal of the work of NTMIS*. For this purpose, AICTE has been providing funds to NTMIS lead Centres (IAMR) and other Nodal Centres depending on their requirement and demand from 1993.

In November 2010, after a review of the NTMIS scheme, AICTE withheld the salary grants of the officials of NTMIS because it was of the view that the data compiled by NTMIS was not found to be useful to AICTE. Thereafter, it was decided that the NTMIS scheme


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should be closed by the AICTE and IAMR. Accordingly, the scheme has been closed on 31 March, 2013 and the AICTE had released payment of salary upto 31st March, 2013 to all the engaged staff of NTMIS. However, according to the learned counsel, both the applicant were drawing their salaries as per recommendation of the Sixth CPC as applicable to the Nodal Centres upto 31.03.2013.

Meanwhile, to examine the issue of the erstwhile NTMIS Scheme and exploring the possibilities of adjustment of staff of nodal centers, a committee namely Bhat Committee was constituted by the MHRD vide MHRD's letter no. 1-71/2010-TS-II dated 11.05.2012 under the Chairmanship of Director, NIT, Jaipur. The committee has recommended 33 staff from different Nodal Centers to consider for absorption at appropriate level in the respective institutions/organizations where these Nodal Centres are operating against the vacant positions.

Later, it was decided in the Ministry that the staff engaged in the erstwhile NTMI Nodal Centres should be considered for absorption in the host Institution against suitable posts based on their Educational Qualification and Experience, as recommended by the Bhat Committee. Accordingly, the Ministry has requested all Nodal Centres to assess the possibility of re-deploying the erstwhile NTMIS staffs against existing vacancies in respective Nodal Centres vide this Ministry letter dated 09/12/2013 and 02.02.2015.
